and people of Texas downtowns, and this year's finalists were announced on Sept. 2 in Austin.

The three official nominations, who are now finalists in their respective categories, are: in the design category up for Best Public Improvement, the Main Street Uvalde "Park Yourself in Uvalde"

painted bench project; in the achievement category up for Best Downtown Partner, Uvalde Radio.net; and in the achievement category up for Best Promotion-Traditional Event, the Main Street Four Square Friday events.

"Three years ago the Coloring at the Cross-roads activity book was nominated, made it to the finals and then won the 'Spirit of Downtown' award at the event," Rios said, adding that last year there were three local nominations, and though two made it to the finals, they ultimately did not win awards.
